# Noor Riyadh 2023: World's Biggest Annual Festival of Light and Art concludes with six Guinness World Records bringing the overall number to 14, while concurrent exhibition continues until 2 March 2024

- Third edition of Noor Riyadh inspires visitors and residents of Saudi Arabia's capital city with dazzling light artworks and a varied community engagement program, collecting a series of Guinness World Record-breaking achievements in the realm of light art by its final night of December 16
- The 2023 records are set by artists Christopher Bauder, Miguel Chevalier, Studio Drift and Yinka Ilori
- The exhibition 'Refracted Identities, Shared Futures' and a series of workshops and public talks continue in JAX District until March 2, 2024

**Riyadh, December 18, 2023** – Noor Riyadh, the critically acclaimed light art festival, celebrated as the world's largest annual event of its kind, has successfully concluded its 2023 edition. The public light art showcase, which ran from November 30 to December 16, transformed Saudi Arabia's capital into a dazzling 'gallery without walls', engaging almost **3 million** visitors with over **120** innovative artworks by more than **100** artists from **30** countries, more than **35** of which are from Saudi Arabia.

Adding six new Guinness World Records to the previous years' achievements, **Christopher Bauder**'s *DIALOGUE* on Al Faisaliyah Tower set a record for the most lights in a light show on a single building as well as the record for the most lights used in a temporary light and sound show, illuminating both Al

Faisaliyah Tower and Kingdom Tower. **Studio Drift**'s *Desert Swarm* created the largest drone bird swarm with an astounding **3,000 drones**. Overall, the festival has also launched the most drones in a week, illuminating the skies with awe-inspiring performances. **Miguel Chevalier**'s *Magic Carpet*, *Origin of the World* presented the largest interactive projection-mapped display while **Yinka llori**'s *Block Cubes* featured the largest temporary skatepark – a surprisingly refreshing experience within a light art festival.

Noor Riyadh 2023, curated by **Jérôme Sans, Pedro Alonzo, Fahad Bin Naif** and **Alaa Tarabzouni** under the theme, *'The Bright Side of the Desert Moon'*, captivated visitors with its exploration of light as a unifying force in these times of progress-induced isolation. Artworks displayed across five main hubs in Riyadh, including the **King Abdullah Financial District** (KAFD), **JAX District**, **Salam Park, Wadi Hanifa** and **Wadi Namar**, offered residents and visitors alike a unique blend of art and technology, redefining the city's nightscape and inviting viewers to slow down, transcend time and space and get together under the magical light of the Riyadh moon.

Highlights included **Janet Echelman**'s transformation of scientific data into visual spectacles, **Diana Thater** and **SUPERFLEX**'s immersive video art projections, and **Christopher Baude**r's *DIALOGUE*, which illuminated Riyadh's architectural landmarks. Middle Eastern and specifically Saudi artists shone brightly, with site-specific commissions and artistic interventions throughout the wadis, parks, and business districts of the city. In Salam Park, **Chourouk Hriech**'s *Cities of Stars* presented structures covered in textiles depicting landscapes of global cities, intertwined with nature's essence. In JAX District, **Muhannad Shono**'s *Absent Sky* created a mesmerizing experience with its play on light and formlessness. **Monira Al Qadiri**'s works – the impactful *Monument* featured in the festival and the luminescent *Zephyr* series, presented in the exhibition – reflected on nature's dualities and microscopic marine life.

# 'Refracted Identities, Shared Futures' Exhibition Continues Until 2 March 2024

While the outdoor citywide artworks will dim their lights tonight, the journey through the dazzling world of art continues with the exhibition 'Refracted Identities, Shared Futures'. Running until March 2, 2024, in the JAX District, the showcase, curated by Neville Wakefield and Maya Al Athel, delves deeper into themes of mythology, astrophysics, and the multifaceted properties of light. Featuring artworks from over 30 artists, the exhibition will keep the spirit of Noor Riyadh 2023 alive, inviting visitors to continue exploring the interplay of light, art, and technology. For example, Badiya Studio's Symphony of Light merges traditional music with innovative technology to celebrate Saudi culture while Farah Al Qasimi's The Swarm offers an immersive video installation exploring the intersection of social media influence and ancestral history. Finally, Sarah Brahim's Memory Machine uses dual film channels to explore the complexities of memory and forgetting, inspired by philosophical musings.

Khaled Al-Hazani, Executive Director of Riyadh Art, expressed his gratitude and excitement: "Noor Riyadh 2023 has not only illuminated our city but also our hearts and minds. As we close this

chapter, we look forward to the ongoing exhibition and the continuous enrichment of Riyadh's art and culture landscape. Our journey towards transforming the capital into a vibrant, creative global hub and 'gallery without walls' is aligned with Saudi Arabia's Vision 2030, and we are thrilled to contribute to this dynamic evolution."

Leaving its mark on the Saudi capital's community with its extensive and diverse engagement programs, the festival featured over 100 workshops, more than 40 talks, over 100 family activities, and more than 1,000 guided tours, adding to the festival's vibrant atmosphere. Playing a pivotal role in nurturing talent, it embedded 41 apprentices into various festival teams while leveraging the support of more than 460 dedicated volunteers and support staff. These initiatives underscore Noor Riyadh's commitment to developing the city's creative economy, fostering creative expression, and supporting local talents.

Over its three editions, Noor Riyadh has achieved a remarkable total of 14 Guinness World Records showcasing the festival's commitment to pushing the boundaries of light art.

### Noor Riyadh 2023:

- 1. **Most Lights in a Light Show on a Single Building:** Christopher Bauder's *DIALOGUE* with 360 individual lights on Al Faisaliyah Tower.
- 2. **Most Lights Used in a Temporary Light and Sound Show:** *DIALOGUE* also achieved a record with 560 lights across Al Faisaliyah Tower and Kingdom Tower.
- 3. Largest Interactive Projection-Mapped Display: 163.72 sqm by Miguel Chevalier's *Magic Carpet, Origin of the World.*
- 4. Largest Temporary Skatepark: Yinka llori's Block Cubes at 994.49 sqm.
- 5. Largest Drone Bird Swarm: Studio Drift's Desert Swarm with 3,000 drones.
- 6. The most drones launched in a week: 21,000 drones.

## Noor Riyadh 2022:

- 1. Largest Light Art Festival: Featuring 201 artworks/installations.
- 2. Most Multirotors/Drones in an Aerial Dance Display: 1,990 drones.
- 3. Largest Laser Show (Area Covered): 14,459,160 m².
